In honor of tap pioneer Leon Collins, STEPOLOGY will offer a full scholarship assistance to attend the 2007 Bay Area Tap Festival instructional workshop, and complimentary tickets to the 2007 Bay Area Rhythm Exchange concert performance.

To be considered for a scholarship award, applicants must be 6-18 years of age and be full time students. Applicants should submit an audition video of up to five minutes in length in DVD or VHS format. The applicant should be clearly identifiable in the video, and the video should show the applicant performing choreographed and improvised tap dancing. Applicants should also submit a letter of at least one page in length which contains the following items:

1. Complete contact information, including name, address, phone, and email;
2. A description of the applicant's background and goals in dance; and
3. Any other information which the applicant feels should be considered
